

Making Money

The objective of this activity is for a 'manager' to achieve a task through teams of people.

This activity must be timed and no allowance for extra time must be made.

You must observe and make notes during the activity using the review sheet.

Elect a 'manager', who will be the ONLY person have copies of the challenge.

Split the rest of the participants into small groups (anything from 3 to 6 people per group is ideal). Each 'team' should elect a leader.

Give the Manager and Team Leaders a walkie-talkie.

Give the Manager the box of resources.

Brief the group altogether, and then remove the manager and give him/her the activity brief.

Ensure that the teams are all at different stations.

Allow the manager 5 minutes to familiarise him/herself with the challenges, and then get the activity started.

The purpose of the activity is for the Manager to maximise results through his/her people within the timescale and certain restrictions.

1. The manager may address the whole group just once.

2. The manager will then be placed in physical isolation – although he/she will be able to speak to his/her team leaders via two-way radio.

3. The manager may meet with his/her team leaders once as a group, and then just once more individually.

4. Managers and team leaders may speak on the radio as often as they wish.

5. There is one box of resources – the manager must decide how to allocate its contents.

6. Each team must work in a separate area.

7. Team members may not visit each others areas, although team leaders can...with the manager's permission.

8. Only **one** team may use laptops/mobiles, the others cannot.

9. Managers and Team Leaders may do the 'work' if the wish.
