

List of Games to Play Online



Treasure Hunt

Who ever hosts the meeting has a prepared list of three (or more) items that all participants should race to go and get.

Game time – max 5 mins

One word at a time

On the chat element of meetings create a story one word at a time. Two options of doing this – either at random (which does make it random!) or you give an order that people write in. The host of the meeting then reads back the story. This one people get a lot better with practice.

Game time – 2 – 10 minutes

Hat game

When turning camera on ensure that all are wearing a hat.

Game time – 2 mins

8 things

Host has a list of things that they will get various participants to say 8 of. Examples cereal, cheese, shoes, hairstyles, vegetables... the list is endless. Great for getting people out of their heads, the host must count 8 and get everyone else to clap when done.

Game time – 1 – 10 minutes.

Two Truths One Lie

Here they individually share two truths and one lie – the team write on chat box which is the lie.

This is a good one to do weekly with a different person.

5 – 10 mins (per person)

Free association

Great for getting out of the head and getting present in the room. Someone starts with a word and everyone else follows it with one word such as... – water – sea – beach – sand – golden – breadcrumbs (etc)

Game time – 3 - 5 minutes

Dis association

The opposite of the above. A lot harder than you think! Saying words that have no association with the previous word. Blue – Wall – Bucket – Grass

Game time 3 – 5 mins (watch how quickly there is an association!)

Match and mirror

Host of meeting does series of movements that we all follow (great state breaker and can get really silly!)

Game time 2 – 5 minutes



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Create a rap

If brave and know each other... Host has downloaded a backing track from Spotify that has a good slow beat – every person adds the next line. Fun, silly and with practice everyone will get better at it.

Game time – 3 – 10 mins long

Object Game

(can be good if you have competitive people) As host you ask two people to get an object from their house – cushion, fork literally anything. They then have to come up with different uses of the object – first one to falter loses. Fun and quick game and opens up imagination.

Game time – 5 – 10 minutes

Sentence game

This game requires a few minutes of prep before the call. Get everyone to write two sentences down. You then have two options:

Going round the participants of the call to say one of their sentences at a time. This will create a very random story – sometimes it is magic though!

Or... as host have a noise or a bell (if you randomly have one of those at home) when in the meeting, if you ring the bell someone then has to read their sentence into the meeting. Its great for breaking the state and keeping people engaged as you say their name as host and then they have to read out what they wrote.

Expert Game

As host you suggest a topic that one of the participants will talk about for one minute as they are the expert... These could be on any subject from stamp collecting, bear dancing, making grandfather clocks and wherever your imagination takes you. Great for imagination, clearing head and chatting. Would suggest that this game suits extroverts a lot more so if you have a lot of introverts in your team give them their topic the day before.
