

Who Owns the Canary?

A simple problem-solving exercise that requires delegates to collaborate if they are to succeed in working out Who Owns the Canary?

There are a number of ways to facilitate this:

- Distribute the clue sheets to different people, and place no restrictions on how this is shared.
- Distribute the clue sheets to different people, and tell them it can only be shared verbally.
- Tell people individually one piece of information (V tricky but handy if you're discussing reliability of information etc)
- You can also add further questions e.g. Who has a blue door?

Cut out the information slips, and distribute them randomly and then set a time for completion (around 15 minutes as a guide).

You can link to problems-solving, communication, collaboration, leadership, conflict etc.



The English person lives in the house with the red door
The Spaniard owns the cat
Coffee is drunk in the house with the green door
The Belgian drinks tea
The Frenchman lives in the first house on the left
A Ford is parked at the house with the yellow door
Milk is drunk in the middle house
The house with the green door is immediately to the right (your right) of the house with the black door
The person who drives the Rover lives in the house next to the man with the horse
The Peugeot driver drinks lemonade
The Dutchman drives a Volvo
The Frenchman lives next door to the house with the blue door
The Ford is parked at the house next door to where the dog is kept
The Vauxhall driver owns fish



The Answer...

The table below contains the complete solution to the problem.

Position	1	2	3	4	5
Front doors	Yellow	Blue	Red	Black	Green
Inhabitants	French	Belgian	English	Spanish	Dutch
Pets	Horse	Dog	Fish	Cat	Canary
Drinks	Water	Tea	Milk	Lemonade	Coffee
Cars	Ford	Rover	Vauxhall	Peugeot	Volvo

From it we can see that the Frenchman drinks water, and that the Dutchman owns the canary!
